St Andrew's Cowling



This year we are celebrating the 50th anniversary of St Andrew's Methodist Church. There will be a special service on May 3rd to commemorate the laying of the foundation stone on May 1st 1965. This will be led by Rev Ken Beardsley. At the time the resident minister (yes, resident in Cowling) was the Rev Guthrie Burgess, whose widow Kathleen, now over 100 years old, is still living at Town End Close in Crosshills.

The congregations of the old Bar Chapel and the Walton Street Mission Rooms united to form the new congregation.

St Andrew's opened on November 27th 1965. The anniversary service on November 29th will be led by Rev Ruth Parry. On Saturday June 27th, starting at 3pm, Rev Nigel Ogley will lead a pilgrimage round the village visiting current and

former sites of worship in Cowling.

In 1965 there was a third large Methodist congregation at Ickornshaw Methodist Chapel. The last service was held there on May 26th 1985, 30 years ago, and of those holding office at St Andrew's who have grown up in the village, many came from Ickornshaw. This year also marks the 30th anniversary of Ickornshaw joining St Andrew's.

May will be a busy month at St Andrew's with 3 special events.
