September was an

unusual month in that we held two Circuit Meetings. Now in the course of things, one meeting in a month is more than enough but at the beginning of the month the Circuit needed to make some decisions on staffing. Rev Sandie Exley-Watts had let the Circuit know that at the end of this year (Aug 2016) she would be retiring and Deacon Claire Gill had asked that she should be released from her present appointment a year early so that she could move into a new appointment, this was for personal reasons. The Meeting agreed on both counts and we have begun the long task of seeking two new ministers - a presbyter and a deacon - to replace Sandie and Claire. At the end of the month we met again, this time to consider other business. Two new policy documents were agreed (Benevolent Fund and Property Group) which can be seen on our website. It is hoped the setting up of The Property Group will help churches and the circuit to manage all aspects of property in a more creative way. Releasing much of this work from the Circuit Leadership Team means that they can focus on

the Mission and growth of the Circuit.

During October all our churches will be engaged in Church Council meetings. This autumn why not take time at your church council to have a conversation about how we share our faith and who with. Perhaps we might ask of ourselves and of our churches are we as effective as we could be in telling of God's love? In Paul's letter to the Romans he asks how will people come to know God unless they have heard of him. Many people may think they know God, whilst in reality they have not truly encountered the God who grants freedom, the God who says Yes rather than No. For much of my childhood I thought that God was a killjoy who stopped me from doing things. As I grew into a teenager I thought that to be a good Christian I needed to not drink, not swear and not be dishonest. As I have matured in years and in faith I realise faith is not about what God limits us doing but about how God enables us to become the best we can be when we walk alongside him in faith and trust. As we walk towards the darker months of Autumn and Winter be encouraged that God is a God of endless possibilities.
