The village of **Haworth** is best known as the home of the Bronte writers & the Keighley & Worth Valley Railway. But Haworth has another claim to fame dating back a century before the Brontes. Without the Rev William Grimshaw, known by the Wesley brothers as The Apostle of the North, there may well be no Airedale circuit today. Grimshaw was the curate at the village parish church in the 1740s, an evangelical at a time when Anglican clergy neglected their people & their church. He encouraged the Methodists, a house group who met in his kitchen at Sowden`s Farm & went on to become effectively the first superintendent minister of a vast circuit known as the Haworth Round which stretched as far as Whitehaven in Cumbria. In 1758 he caused the first Methodist preaching house to be built in Haworth. This year marks the 260th anniversary of the formation of the first Methodist group, a heritage of which the faithful Haworth folk are understandably proud. They have offered to lead guided walks around Grimshaw sites or to give talks about Grimshaw but so far have had no takers. The offers are still there. Ring 01535 661475 for information.

A letter from Sister Jean Stephenson regarding the Blenheim Project: Over the past 38 years a lot has been achieved with the project, but sadly this last week August 6th a meeting was called to make very big decisions, for Bradford Council had decided they would no longer be able to support financially, due to the cuts in funding from Central Government, and that for us to tender to the set agreement laid down, we could not compete with others. Therefore the Trustees recommendation, that because of our size and resources we cannot compete to tender. Also it would mean to contradict our pledge and commitment to our service users plus issues of safeguarding which we have held under the new provision to be unsuitable.

I would like to say thank you to the people in our Circuit through Network who have given and shared in many ways this splendid project. Furniture, household goods, food for harvest, toys for children at Christmas and coffee mornings to raise money through the collecting boxes. All so generously and wonderfully given and one could go on.

The staff have worked hard and credit must be given for all that they have done, both in the house and resettling women and children in suitable accommodation even though they have taken pay cuts, this is devastating to them. We want to praise them for the pressure they have been under caring for women experiencing domestic violence and homelessness.

We pray that this will not mean more homelessness.
